2010 ART CAMP

2010 Art Camp took students on a journey through history. Students began their journey learning about the arts of the caveman and created their own cave drawings. They traveled to the Middle East and learned the techniques used in creating pottery without using a wheel. Next the students traveled down the Nile and built their own pyramids and designed their own sarcophaguses. They then sailed across the Mediterranean to Ancient Greece to take part in the Greek tragedies by creating their own masks. First week ended with the Middle Ages of Europe and students became knights and designed their own shields and banners.

The second week students were introduced to the Renaissance and had the opportunity to have a firsthand experience for what it was like for Michelangelo to paint the Sistine Chapel. The week continued with students exploring the works of the Impressionist artists through watercolor paintings, the various styles of Picasso, drip paintings of the Expressionists and Andy Warhol's famous Campbell Soup Cans. Students also took part in the morning cartoon class taught by Village staff, Rand Cabeal. The students learned about the different types of cartoons and designed their own characters. *gv*
